Knows about 400 vocabulary words and can have a basic conversation about themselves in the language	If your Kindergarten student can read and write this sentence on their own... <i>"The cat jumped on the couch."</i> Congratulations! They are at a 1 <sup>st</sup> Grade level and might be OK in Level 1.	Level 2: Start at Lesson 1	Level 2: Start at Lesson 1
Knows most basic vocabulary and can have a basic conversation about themselves in the language but would have a hard time having the same conversation about someone else the language. For example: <i>"I eat sandwiches for lunch."</i> vs <i>"He eats sandwiches for lunch."</i>	*Not Recommended for Kindergarten students*  Kindergarten students are not usually comfortable in our Level 3 classes because of the level of reading and writing required.	Level 3: Start at Lesson 1  *Caution: FLY has found that 1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup> grade students may find Level 3 difficult because of grammatical concepts involved*	Level 3: Start at Lesson 1
Can conjugate regular verbs but cannot conjugate irregular or reflexive verbs. If they do not know the difference, they would like this level. 😊	*Not Recommended for Kindergarten students*	*Not Recommended for 1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup> Grade Students*  FLY finds that most 1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup> grade students may find Level 4 difficult because of the level of grammatical concepts involved.	Level 4: Start at Lesson 1
Can communicate proficiently in present tense but may have a hard time coming up with things to say without a clear direction.	*Not Recommended for Kindergarten students*	*Not Recommended for 1 <sup>st</sup> & 2 <sup>nd</sup> Grade Students*	Level 5: Start at Lesson 1
